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ntroduction:

The National Sleep Medicine Course (NSMC) is being organized in collaboration with the academic faculty from the United States, Japan and India. The course is intended to provide all the essential theoretical knowledge and practical training necessary for practicing sleep medicine. It will cover basic sleep science, in addition to the technical and clinical aspects of sleep science. The course is primarily meant for an Indian audience. During the 2nd Interim World Congress of World Federation of Sleep Research Society and Medical Societies (WFSRSMS), held at New Delhi during September 2005, a dedicated group of sleep scientists of Indian origin from USA along with their Indian colleagues took the initiative in starting this sleep medicine education in India. The first course (NSMC 2006) was organized at AIIMS, New Delhi during October 14-15, 2006 on an experimental basis under the initiative of Dr. Deepak Shrivastava along with Dr. H.N. Mallick. The overwhelming response and clinical success of the NSMC 2006 has encouraged us to continue the program annually on a regional basis. The 2nd course (NSMC 2007) was organized at NIMHANS, Bangalore by Dr. Bindu M. Kutty. The 3rd (NSMC 2008) was organized at Cuttack by Dr. Arpita Priyadarshini and the 4th course (NSMC 2009) was organized in New Delhi by Dr. Manvir Bhatia. This year, the 5th course (**NSMC 2010**) is being organized at Thiruvananthapuram, Kerala by Dr. Kamalesh K. Gulia.

Target audience:

The 2-days' NSMC course is designed for neurologists, pulmonologists, general practitioners, healthcare professionals, sleep technicians and sleep scientists. The course is limited to 75-100 participants, on a first-cum-first-served basis and a registration fee is applicable. The faculty will cover major topics in Sleep medicine over didactic sessions and hands-on workshops. These topics would include Sleep basics: physiology and pharmacology, nuts and bolts of a sleep laboratory, common sleep disorders, recording and interpretation of common tests used in sleep medicine (including polysomnography and multiple sleep latency test). The faculty will also discuss new developments in the area of sleep medicine.

After attending the workshop, the participants should be able to handle confidently common problems in sleep medicine, including making correct diagnosis, choosing right tests, reading and understanding their interpretations, and providing the appropriate therapy. Sleep technicians should be able to perform all the required tests with confidence and to independently handle common problems which may arise while conducting these tests.

The participants will receive a certificate upon successful completion of the course. The registration is limited. Kindly register early to avoid disappointment.

Please note: This year's NSMC will be a special attraction as it will be followed, on 13th December 2010, by the 4th Conference of the Indian Society for Sleep Research (ISSR). Those who are registering for both NSMC and the conference of ISSR, can avail of a special concession in registration.
