Animal Research of SCTIMST is comprised of 3 divisions basically upon which the major research groups in and outside the institute relies upon.

The Division of In Vivo Models and Testing - This laboratory develops animal models for proof of concept studies of medical devices as well as preclinical evaluation of medical devices as per GLP requirements.

Toxicology Division is a premier laboratory in the country in the field of biomaterial toxicology, and has a full-fledged facility for the pre-clinical evaluation of various materials and medical devices as per International Standards like ISO, USP and ASTM, accredited by COFRAC France as per ISO 17025.

Division of Laboratory Animal Science works for the "humane care, state of art management and supply of small laboratory animals of quality" for accredited testing and scientific research activities as per ISO 10993 - Part-II guidelines on an International platform and CPCSEA guidelines on the National platform.

Thiruvananthapuram: Thiruvananthapuram formerly known as Trivandrum, is the capital of Kerala and the city gets its name from the word, Thiru-anantha-puram, meaning the "Abode of Lord Ananta". This world famous and richest temple of Vishnu reclining on Anantha remains the iconic landmark of the city.
