Profile of the speaker - Dr Elizabeth Mathai



Dr Elizabeth Mathai is a Retired Prof and Head the Department of Clinical Microbiology, Christian Medical College, Vellore with over 30 years of teaching and research experience. She has taught or been trainer to many undergraduate and postgraduate medical and paramedical programmes in India, Fiji, the United Kingdom and several training modules of the World Health Organization. Over the past two years she has contributed to teaching MSc students at the Liverpool School of Tropical Medicine.

She has over 100 research publications and several evidence-based publications by WHO. Her main research areas involved collaboration with reputed institutes such as Liverpool School of Tropical Medicine, Karolinska Institute, Stockholm Sweden, Trinity College Dublin and institutions in India and Fiji. She continues to contribute to research in Liverpool School of Tropical Medicine in the form of developing research projects for funding. A recent grant application for a European Community research grant, to understand burden of some vaccine preventable infections in sub Saharan Africa, was successful and she is continuing to help with this project as the Microbiology consultant.
