The Medical Social Work Division of SCTIMST, Thiruvananthapuram, observed World Social Work Day on 19 March 2024 at the SCTIMST Campus and organized an outreach program at Sri Chitra Home Pazhavangadi, Thiruvananthapuram on 23 March 2024. It emphasises the need for social workers to adopt innovative, community-led approaches that are grounded in indigenous wisdom and harmonious coexistence with nature.

Program -1 Sensitization sessions at SCTIMST, Campus; Poster Display and Short Speeches

The MSW of SCTIMST, team Thiruvananthapuram, organized interactive sessions at Sri Chitra Home Pazhavangadi. The Sri Chitra Home is managed by the Department of Social Justice, Government of Kerala, for children in distress and offers long-term residential care for them. It is an organisation working for the holistic development of the needy and vulnerable children, which accommodates approximately 135 members. The resource person for the sessions was **Dr Bindu** V. Associate Professor, Paediatrics & Medical

Superintendent of SAT Hospital,Thiruvananthapuram.

The sessions were divided into two parts, the first session was for children in the preadolescent age and it focussed on personal health care practices and the second session was on ageappropriate behaviour and sensitizing them on being protected from abuse by letting them know about good and bad touches. The interactive sessions were much appreciated and it was evident in the response and participation. In the meantime, both groups were engaged with hands-on exercises on team building and interpersonal communication skills and this session was handled by the team members of the social work division of SCTIMST.
